Automotive Collision Repair Technician Program

Basic Theory along with hands on shop practice enables students to become proficient in auto collision repair.

Prepares students for entry-level jobs in the automotive collision repair trade.

The major employers of auto collision personnel are dealerships, privately owned service shops and franchised auto collision shops.



Automotive Collision Repair

- Full time diploma of trades training
- Receive Foundation, plus level 2, plus level 3.
- All apprenticeship training delivered in 40 weeks
- Includes a two-week industry based work practicum.
- Receive 615 hours of credit towards apprenticeship completion requirements.
- Successful completion of the program qualifies a student to work in a repair facility, enroll in an apprenticeship program and receive credit from the ITA for on the job training.
- Upon completion of the collision repair program, the student is eligible to write their Inter-provincial exam. The student will receive their score, and will obtain their credential when the required apprenticeship hours have been completed.
- The advantage to a shop owner is that the collision repair student does not have to return to school to complete their training, which helps reduce cost and maintains shop productivity.
